

## **University of Illinois College of Medicine Policy on Student Work Hours**

### **Introduction**

The primary purpose of medical students involved in clinical educational experiences is to learn. As extended hours can cause fatigue and compromise the student's ability to retain information, limitations in attendance are necessary.

### **Attendance Limitations on Student Assignments**

The following attendance limitations are established for all clinical experiences:

1. The maximum number of required hours at clinical sites (hospital, clinic, nursing home, etc.) should not exceed 80 hours per week.
2. There should be no required consecutive overnight call.
3. Night call should be assigned no more than an average of Q4 over the duration of the experience.
4. Night call should not be required the day before administration of the end of clerkship examination.
5. Students should have an average of at least one day (24 hours) each week free of clinical responsibilities (including lectures, seminars, clinic, rounds).

The above restrictions do not include independent study time apart from clinical duties, consecutive evening shifts, and optional activities in which the student voluntarily participates.
